Species	Description	Light and Soil Types	Mature Size
<b>Compact Inkberry</b> <i>Ilex glabra</i> 'Compacta'	Medium evergreen shrub. Female selection. Flowers attract pollinators, berries are enjoyed by birds and small mammals.	Full sun to part sun  Adaptable to any soil type after establishing period	3-4 feet tall, 2-3 feet wide  Can be trimmed into a dense hedge, native alternative to Boxwood.
<b>Dwarf Wax Myrtle</b> <i>Morella cerifera</i> 'Don's Dwarf'	Fragrant medium sized evergreen shrub. Female selection. Yellow-green leaves can be used as a seasoning. Small, waxy fruit is enjoyed by birds. Popular with landscapers and wildlife.	Any light and any soil type.  Very adaptable and easy to care for.	4 feet tall, 3 feet wide  Natural rounded growth habit make this plant easy to prune
<b>Dwarf Walter's Viburnum</b> <i>Viburnum obovatum</i>	Medium evergreen shrub. Clusters of white or pink flowers bloom in the spring. Easy to manage as privacy or on borders. Birds eat the fruit. Grows well in most conditions except for deep shade or extremely dry soil.	Full sun to part sun Average soil moisture	Different cultivars reach different heights, usually 4-5 feet tall and 3-4 feet wide.
<b>Coastal Doghobble</b> <i>Leucothoe axillaris</i>	Medium evergreen shrub with shiny foliage and white spring flowers. Great edge or accent plant in shady areas of a landscape. Attractive year-round.	Part sun to full shade Adaptable to most soil types.  Needs full shade if grown in very dry soil.	3-4 feet tall, 3 feet wide
<b>Coontie</b> <i>Zamia integrifolia</i>	Florida's only native cycad! A plant with prehistoric roots. Evergreen and slow growing. Wildlife enjoy the fruit. Butterfly host plant.	Any light and soil conditions except flooded. Very adaptable	2-3 feet tall, 3-4 feet wide
<b>Darrow's Blueberry</b> <i>Vaccinium darrowii</i> 'Rosa's Blush'	Medium evergreen shrub. The smallest of the native blueberries we carry. Great as a low foundation plant. Small berries, but just as tasty and sweet! Lovely foliage with hues of pink and blue.	Full sun to part sun  Dry to average soil moisture.	3-4 feet tall, 2-3 feet wide
<b>Georgia Savory</b> <i>Calamintha sp.</i>	Small fragrant evergreen shrub. Showy flowers in the fall and spring attract pollinators. Great choice for a low border shrub. Adapts well to shade.	Full sun to high shade  Tolerates most soil types with good drainage.	2-3 feet tall, 3 feet wide
<b>Dwarf Yaupon Holly</b> <i>Ilex vomitoria</i> 'Oscar'	Medium size evergreen shrub. Leaves contain caffeine and were made into a drink by local indigenous people. Great choice for a low hedge or border.	Full sun to part shade  Very adaptable. Tolerates poor sandy or clay soil.	3 - 5 feet tall, 4-5 feet wide  Can be trimmed into a dense hedge, native alternative to Boxwood.

Species	Description	Light and Soil Types	Mature Size
<b>Rabbiteye Blueberry</b> <i>Vaccinium ashei</i>	Tall deciduous multi-stemmed shrub. White bell shaped flowers in the spring are important for native bees including a specialist bee. Delicious fruit! Easy to grow and prune. Great red-orange fall color.	Full sun to high shade Dry to average soil moisture	12 feet tall, 6 feet wide.  New stems that arise from the base are easy to prune to maintain shape or size.
<b>Highbush Blueberry</b> <i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	Similar to Rabbiteye's description above. Smaller fruit compared to Rabbiteye, but just as tasty! Planting a mix of different blueberries can ensure there is enough for wildlife and human enjoyment.	Full sun to high shade Dry to average soil moisture.	12 feet tall, 6 feet wide.  New stems that arise from the base are easy to prune to maintain shape or size.
<b>Simpson's stopper</b> <i>Myrcianthes fragrans</i>	Evergreen, large shrub to small tree with dense fragrant foliage, attractive flowers, and showy fruit. Flowers attract bees and butterflies. Salt tolerant. Great choice for privacy screening.	Full sun to part sun Dry to average soil moisture	10-20 feet tall, 8 feet wide
<b>American Beautyberry</b> <i>Callicarpa americana</i>	Deciduous, upright multi-stemmed shrub. Flowers in late spring followed by clusters of magenta berries in fall. Berries are popular with birds and other wildlife. Berries can be processed into a jelly. Fragrant leaves have mosquito repelling properties.	Shade to part sun  Adaptable to most soils except flooded conditions	4-8 feet tall, 4-8 feet wide  Can tolerate being trimmed back to maintain a smaller size.
<b>Arrowwood Viburnum</b> <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	Deciduous, large multi-stemmed tree-like shrub. Large showy flower clusters in spring, berries in summer for birds. Butterfly host plant. Great option for a spreading hedge or can be easily pruned to a narrow shrub or small tree shape.	High shade to part sun Wet to average soil moisture.  Tolerates dry soil in high shade.	8-10 feet tall, 4-6 foot spread
<b>Coralbean</b> <i>Erythrina herbacea</i>	Medium to large perennial shrub. Dies back in winter and re-sprouts in spring. Bright red flowers in spring. Red seeds add winter interest. Unique leaves and flowers. Stems have thorns and berries are toxic if eaten. Plant away from walkways or curious pets and children. Hummingbird favorite. Salt tolerant.	Full sun to part sun Dry to average soil moisture	3-4 feet tall, 3-4 feet wide

<b>Species</b>	<b>Description</b>	<b>Light and Soil Types</b>	<b>Mature Size</b>
<b>Saw Palmetto</b> <i>Serenoa repens</i>	Showy evergreen palm. Berries are an important food source for wildlife. Great choice for privacy screening or as a specimen. Green and silver options available	Full sun to part sun Dry to average soil moisture	4-8 feet tall, 4-6 feet wide
<b>Florida Flame Azalea</b> <i>Rhododendron austrinum</i>	Small deciduous large shrub to small tree, one of our showy native Azaleas! Azaleas are commonly an understory species in the wild. Great choice for a small specimen in a protected area. Showy, fragrant flowers in early spring.	Less than 6 hours of direct sun or high shade Well drained soil	10 feet tall, 6 feet wide
<b>Pinxter Azalea</b> <i>Rhododendron canescens</i>	Similar to the Flame Azalea description above. Native Azaleas have a more airy and open growth form compared to non-native Azaleas. Showy pink flowers in early spring.	Less than 6 hours of direct sun or high shade Well drained soil	10 feet tall, 6 feet wide
<b>Oakleaf Hydrangea</b> <i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	Tall deciduous multi-stemmed shrub. Showy flowers in summer and vivid fall color. Native to forest slopes, happy in understory or shaded areas. Landscaping favorite. Add into a mixed hedge or privacy border with evergreen shrubs.	Part shade Tolerates most soils except flooded conditions.	6-10 feet tall, can be cut back occasionally to keep at a lower height.
<b>False Rosemary</b> <i>Conradina canescens</i>	Fragrant, medium size evergreen shrub. Showy flowers from spring into fall. Pollinator favorite. Silvery foliage and purple flowers can be spotted in the wild along roadsides. Needs good airflow, very drought tolerant.	Full sun to part sun Dry to average soil moisture	3 feet tall, 3 feet wide
<b>Bedstraw St. John's Wort</b> <i>Hypericum galioides</i>	Medium size evergreen shrub with a bushy growth habit. Yellow flowers in summer are popular with pollinators. Great choice for foundational plant or border. One of 34 St. John's Wort species native to Florida.	Part sun to shade Tolerates most soil types	4 feet tall, 3 feet wide
<b>Ocala Anise</b> <i>Illicium parviflorum</i>	Large evergreen shrub with fragrant glossy leaves. Yellow flowers in spring. Very dense foliage, great for privacy hedges or natural screening. Deer resistant. Provides habitat for birds and small mammals.	Part sun to full shade Tolerates most soil types	6-12 feet tall, 6-10 feet wide
<b>Florida Sunshine Anise</b> <i>Illicium parviflorum</i> 'Florida Sunshine'	Smaller cultivar of Ocala Anise, with bright yellow foliage. Fragrant with flowers in the summer. Great as a border or accent to brighten the landscape year round. Adds color to shade gardens.	Part sun to full shade Tolerates most soil types	5 feet tall, 4 feet wide

Species	Description	Light and Soil Types	Mature Size
<b>Virginia Sweetspire</b> <i>Itea virginica</i> 'Henry's Garnet'	Medium size semi-evergreen shrub. Fragrant flowers attract bees and butterflies in the spring. Leaves turn shades of yellow, orange, and red in the fall. Seeds are used as a food source by songbirds. 'Henry's Garnet' is a medium sized cultivar selected for its smaller size.	Full sun to part sun Wet to average soil moisture	3 - 5 feet tall, 4-6 feet wide
<b>Florida Anise</b> <i>Illicium floridanum</i>	Large evergreen shrub. Fragrant leaves and red flowers in the spring are followed by star-shaped seed pods. Deer and rabbit resistant. Tolerates heavy shade. Slightly smaller than the Ocala Anise and handles wet soils better.	Part shade to full shade Moist, well-drained, acidic soils rich in organic matter.	6-10 feet tall, 6-8 feet wide. Dense habit.
