
Species	Description	Light and Soil Types	Mature Size
<b>White Oak</b> <i>Quercus alba</i>	Medium to large size deciduous tree. All oaks are keystone species that provide food and shelter resources to many types of wildlife. Deep orange fall color. Excellent shade tree.	Full sun to part sun Dry to average soil moisture	Up to 50 feet tall Open canopy
<b>Sand Live Oak</b> <i>Quercus geminata</i>	Large size. Evergreen. Salt tolerant and ideal for coastal environments. Acorns of oak trees are an important food source for wildlife.	Full sun to high shade Dry to average soil moisture	30 - 40 feet tall
<b>Pignut Hickory</b> <i>Carya glabra</i>	Medium to large size deciduous tree. Flowers in the spring attract bees. Golden fall color. Hickory trees are known for their strong wood and edible nuts. Host plant for the showy Luna moth.	Any light conditions, slower growth in shade Dry to average soil moisture	Up to 50 feet tall Open canopy
<b>Red Maple</b> <i>Acer rubrum</i>	Medium to large size deciduous tree. Spring flowers provide an early food source for native bees. Vibrant red fall color. Host plant for the showy Rosy Maple Moth.	Full sun to part sun Adaptable to most soil types	40 - 50 feet tall Open canopy
<b>Bald Cypress</b> <i>Taxodium distichum</i>	Medium to large size deciduous tree. Bright green summer leaves with vibrant orange fall color. Provides nesting habitat for birds. Excellent choice for wet soils, but adaptable. State protected keystone species critical to maintaining a healthy ecosystem.	Full sun to part sun Adaptable to most soil types Smaller in dry soils	30 - 75 feet tall 15 - 20 foot spread
<b>Longleaf Pine</b> <i>Pinus palustris</i>	Medium to large size, evergreen conifer. Largest Pine tree in the south. Keystone species that provide an abundance of resources for wildlife. Butterfly host plant. Seeds are a valuable food source for squirrels and the Northern Bobwhite Quail. Provides filtered sunlight for understory.	Full sun Adaptable to most soil types Smaller in dry soils	30 - 40 feet tall in poor dry soil Can grow up to 120 feet if planted near a water table
<b>Eastern Redcedar</b> <i>Juniperus virginiana</i>	Large evergreen conifer with a cylindrical growth form and dark green foliage. Can be pruned into more of a narrow or treelike shape. Excellent for privacy in a large area. Great wind resistance. Provides shelter and food resources for birds.	Full sun to high shade Adaptable to most soil types	30 feet tall 15-20 feet wide



Species	Description	Light and Soil Types	Mature Size
<b>Black Gum</b> <i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>	Medium size deciduous tree. Spring flowers attract native bees and fruit attracts birds. Magenta fall color. Host plant for multiple butterflies.	Full sun to part sun Adaptable to most soil types	30 - 60 feet tall 15 - 20 foot canopy
<b>American Persimmon</b> <i>Diospyros virginiana</i>	Medium size deciduous tree. Flowers in the summer attract bees. Fruits are loved by birds and wildlife. Delicious fruit is bitter if unripe. Vibrant orange fall color. Caterpillar host plant that feeds songbirds.	Full sun to high shade Dry to average soil moisture	25 - 40 feet tall Narrow  Smaller when planted in dry upland areas
<b>Green Ash</b> <i>Fraxinus pennsylvanica</i>	Medium to large size deciduous tree. Excellent choice for a shade tree. Flowers in the spring attract bees. Golden fall color. Host plant for the showy Eastern Tiger Swallowtail butterfly.	Any light conditions, slower growth in shade Dry to average soil moisture	Up to 30 feet tall, Open canopy
<b>River Birch</b> <i>Betula nigra</i>	Medium sized deciduous tree, usually with multiple trunks. Very adaptable. Showy bark and golden fall color. Attracts and feeds birds. Host plant for the showy Eastern Tiger Swallowtail butterfly	Full sun to high shade Adaptable to most soil types.  Does well in wet soils.	30-50 feet tall, upright, open growth habit
<b>Post Oak</b> <i>Quercus stellata</i>	Medium sized deciduous tree. Smaller than a White Oak. Great choice for a more compact Oak tree. Sturdy and hardy with great fall color.	Full sun to Part Sun Dry to average soil	20-30 feet tall, open canopy
<b>Myrtle Oak</b> <i>Quercus myrtifolia</i>	Small tree or large shrub. Evergreen. All the benefits of an Oak in a smaller size. Performs as a shrub in beach dune habitats. Thrives in dry soils. Great choice for privacy screening.	Full sun to high shade Dry to average soil moisture	5 - 20 feet tall Wide canopy
<b>Button Bush</b> <i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>	Small deciduous wetland tree. Abundant showy flowers in summer. Attracts a wide range of butterflies and other pollinators.	Full sun to part sun Flooded to average soil moisture	10-15 feet tall, open canopy
